Report of the Trustees for the Period 11 October 2013 to 31 March 2015

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

A Advance citizenship and community development in the area defined by a) encouraging voluntary activity and increasing the involvement of individuals in community activity by assisting voluntary organisations, charities and social enterprises to develop their skills in, for example, managing and operating a community asset; and b) to assist in the regeneration of the area through the improvement of the physical, social and economic environment

B Manage community land and associated assets for the benefit of the Community and the public in general.

C Provide, or assist in providing, recreational facilities, and/or organising recreational activities, which will be available to members of the Community and public at large with the object of improving the conditions of life of the Community.

D Advance community development, including urban or rural regeneration within the Community.

E Advance the education of the Community about its environmental, cultural, heritage and/or history.

F Advance environmental protection or improvement including preservation, sustainable development and conservation of the natural environment, the maintenance, improvement or provision of environmental amenities for the community and/or the preservation of sites of historical, architectural or other importance to the community.

Significant activities

A Under this objective STP has leased the caravan site to the Caravan Company of Great Britain and in returned the town has received an inward investment of £1 .9M. We also secured external funding for an all-weather pitch and additional inward investment for the Town Hall

B. In this section we have been active in the caravan park again, a harbour feasibility study, working on re-generating the site of the old gas works and endeavouring to return the Court House (closed in May 2014) to the community.

C. Significant achievements here with the establishment of the all weather pitch. Also acted as lead on the community wide consultation on the leisure usages available at the harbour.

D. This purpose has seen the award from the Coastal Community Fund which has permitted of a) purchase of a Land Train b)employ 4 part-time drivers and 4 part-time conductors c) employment of a Development Worker. In addition work has been expended on endeavouring to restore the site of the gas works, the old Lodging House and the Court House to community usage.

E. The major thrust here has been the endeavour to re-open the Court House and retain the existing (listed) Court Room as a heritage room so that the community can understand the historical course of justice in Stonehaven.

F. Improving the amenities of Stonehaven is important to Stonehaven and STP has been successful in achieving a major re-vamp of the caravan park, produced a vision for the future of the town's Recreational Grounds and conducted a feasibility study if usage at the harbour. Current projects include examining the prospects of transferring the Court House from Scottish Court Services to a local organisation and forming a partnership with Aberdeenshire Council to operate Toilets at the beach.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Without a doubt the two main achievements were:

a) the purchase and operation of the Land Train which has become a tourist attraction for the benefit of the whole community. During the summer season of 2014 nearly 4000 tourists took advantage of this unique experience in the NE b) the re-generation of the caravan park which is now described as the jewel in CCGB's crown. During 2014-2015 the park has been fully booked every weekend even during the week advance booking has been recommended. The economic benefit to Stonehaven is yet to be assessed but it is considerable.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

Like most charitable organisations funding is a constant problem and whilst we run a very prudent shop' our level of reserves is too low for comfort and we have to try to obtain additional funding in the future. There is no immediate problem as a close eye is kept on finances and we do not incur any debt.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery

- 25% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
